What is After School Connection (ASC)?

Hillel Community Day School offers an exciting After School Connection program for current students and their families. Running from 3:30-6:00 PM, this structured program provides diverse activity options each day including homework time, snack, and both structured and unstructured play time activities. All Hillel students have the option to enroll in any After School Clubs and events offered.

When do parents pick up their children?

Parent are welcome to pick up their children at any time during ASC. We ask that you try not to pick up your child in the middle of a club because it could disrupt club activities.





Where and how to pick up your child?

The ASC doors are in the back of the school by the garden. To pick up your child please call the ASC phone 5-10 minutes before you arrive so that staff can get them packed up. When you arrive you can either ring the bell at the garden door or give us a call again and we will bring your child out to you.

How is ASC priced and billed?

ASC is billed monthly at a rate of \$5/hour to the closest hour. Club fees are an additional charge (please see this packet for more information). Please advise in advance whether monthly receipts for FSA reimbursements are needed. Otherwise, an annual statement is provided for tax purposes. Monday:

Tabletop Gaming Club with Mr. Bowman grades 4-8: The Tabletop Gaming Club (TGC) is a group for youth who enjoy any kind of strategy, cooperative, or role-playing games. Our attention will initially be the classic fantasy-adventure RPG, Dungeons and Dragons (Fifth Edition), but we enjoy tabletop games of all types! Students will learn to run their own adventures and games, with a special focus on promoting good sportsmanship. Tabletop games can be some of the most engaging forms of social interaction. Encouraging critical thinking, problem-solving, and creativity, they test our adaptability, teamwork skills, and create exciting competition.

Disney Club with Ms. Ashalynn Kirkland grades K-2: The HAPPIEST club at school! Disney club is for students who love all things Disney. We will make Disney themed crafts, explore Disney stories and their themes, take part in Disney trivia, sing Disney songs, participate in drawing challenges, and so much more!

Vex Robotics grades 3-8: Come learn about robots and build your own! We use commercial kits to build different components of robots – cars, robot arms, simple machines, and sensors. These exercises familiarize students with programming, sensors, and automation. It helps hone critical computational thinking skills and encourages creativity, teamwork and problem solving. Our ultimate goal is to participate in regional robot competitions!

Tuesday:

Strings Club with Mr. Jonathan Allentoff grades 3-8: We invite you to join us in the joy of making music as we learn and grow our skills on violin and viola. This club will engage beginning and advancing players in grades 3-8 throughout the year, and we'll look forward to presenting recitals. The activities will cover technical and expressive performance techniques, a variety of musical styles and genres, and valuable team building skills with the Essential Elements Interactive and String Builder methods. Participants will rent their violin or viola and accessories and purchase their copy of the two method books (Essential Elements Interactive and String Builder).



Exercise Club with Mr. Papkin grades 3-8: Exercise Club is going to be a blast! Students from 3rd through 8th grade will be running, participating in fun movement challenges, and learning how to maintain a healthy body. Participants will also learn about safe and responsible stretches and body weight exercises as they build their strength and endurance!

Wednesday:

Talmud Club with Rabbi Lagunov grades 4-8: Join Rabbi L. for a dynamic and deep dive into one of our people's greatest texts. We will explore the Talmud through a modern lens, uncovering ethical dilemmas and ways to respond to today's latest issues. This interactive and energetic study will definitely get you excited about uncovering our people's past in an effort to understand how to live in our current world.

Drama Club with Miss Courtwright and Miss Wisset grades 1-8: Join this year-long club dedicated to developing your child's theatrical skills and talents. This club will engage 1st-8th graders of all interest levels throughout the entire year. Our young thespians will participate in activities, including improvisation, role play, and set design. The club will culminate in two performances on June 7th in school and June 8th for parents. The show is TBD.

***Students may only sign up during the first trimester and must stay committed for the entire school year.**





Thursday:

Gardening Club with Mr. Irving grades K-8: Garden club gives interested students extra time with various types of growing projects. They will assist Mr. Irving in expanding and managing hydroponic projects and experiments around the school as well as caring for the garden. Students will also be empowered to undertake their own experiments and growing projects. We will even get to eventually take some plants home!

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Friday:

Minecraft Club with Ms. Amanda Hammack grades 3-8: Explore all there is to see in the world of Minecraft. Students will each get a Minecraft account and will use it to create new worlds. Students will also bring the real world into the virtual one using new skills and technology. Space is limited.

Superhero Club with Mr. Alex Hill grades K-2: Superhero club is a great club where fans of all kinds can celebrate their favorite superheroes. Students will learn about how superheroes came to be, discuss comics, play games, have contests, and so much more. Open to all K-2 students, even those without secret identities.
